Session 2: Roman East Anglia

This session looks at the archaeological evidence for the impact of the Roman invasion on the Iron Age tribes in East Anglia, which culminated in the Boudican Revolt and resulted in five centuries of Roman rule in the region. Subjects covered include Roman forts, roads, settlements and religion, and key sites such Colchester, Burgh Castle, Fison Way and Caistor St Edmund.
