

The Cold War in the Brecks Project

Between March 2019 and April 2021, The Breckland Society undertook a Heritage Lottery Heritage Fund-supported project called *The Cold War in the Brecks*.

The main aim of the project was to explore the military history of the area from the conclusion of the Second World War until the effective end of the Cold War with the final breakup of the Soviet Union in 1991. Among the objectives was to identify, document and understand what constitutes 'Cold War heritage' in the Brecks, particularly the various built structures that relate to that period, as well as collating the reminiscences of people involved in both military and civilian activities relating to the Cold War.
